NOVEMBER IS NATIONAL ADOPTION MONTH

Every November, families, advocates, and communities across the country observe National Adoption Month. National Adoption Month started in Massachusetts in 1976 when then-Governor Michael Dukakis initiated "Adoption Week." The movement quickly gained momentum, and in 1984, President Ronald Reagan proclaimed the first National Adoption Week. In 1995, President Bill Clinton expanded the event to cover the entire month of November. Since then, November has been a time for people across the country to come together to recognize the love, challenges, and growth that adoption brings to families. For many children in foster care, the journey to a permanent family is filled with both hope and uncertainty. National Adoption Month provides an opportunity to shed light on the realities faced by thousands of youth who wait in foster care for a loving, stable home. While many children are successfully placed each year, approximately 114,000 children in the United States are still awaiting adoption. In rural Nevada there are 13 children being

recruited for their forever home. The field of adoption is evolving with increased awareness around trauma-informed care, family preservation, and post-adoption support services. For foster and adoptive parents, National Adoption Month is a reminder that you're part of a larger movement. Together, adoptive families, communities, and advocates are working toward a future where every child has a loving, supportive, and stable family.
