CAREGIVERS SUPPORT TEAM

We are very excited to announce that we are developing a Caregiver's Support Team that consists of Co-Parent Coaches, Trainers, Trackers and Success Story Videos. -Kin Minor

- The goal is to have Empathetic Caregiving Co-Parent coaches provide tips, share experiences and share feedback to other Caregivers providing clear expectations of working with Birth Parents as experts on their children.
- Our objective is to make sure every child living in foster care is cared for by a caregiver (foster, relative, fictive and/or adoptive) who possesses Co-Parenting skills. These caregivers will have the knowledge, ability and support necessary to successfully nurture children who have experienced trauma while providing a safe, loving and healing environment. As a result these children can thrive, while maintain connections to their biological family.
- We will empower Caregivers by allowing them access to pertinent information and engaging them in important meetings.
- Caregivers will also be included in decision making and will be provided with the tools and resources they need to successfully impact our children's lives.
- Most Biological parents have at some point been engaged in their child's life. Even if only the amount of time a mother carried her child before birth. That too is crucial information in the development of the child and the only way to get that information is by engaging the Birth Parent(s).
- We are also developing a Birth Parent Advocate/Coach Support Team to assist struggling Birth Parents with positive empathic coaching. A Birth Parent's assigned coach(s) will help them understand expectations by providing them a safe place to ask questions while being someone for the Birth Parent(s) to lean on through the process of reunification.
- Our objective here is to empower Birth parents to be part of the system change. We want to make that transition handled in a child-centered way with the child's needs as the most important aspect of the move into your home.
- We will be asking Biological Parents to work with Caregivers as Co-Parents every step of the way.
