I know, it just seems too early to be talking about school, but this information will benefit you AND our kiddos come August 6!

- Did you know that foster youth are entitled to remain in their school of origin as long as they are in Washoe County custody and do not need a Variance? It's true and it's the law!
- Did you also know that if a case closes mid-school year this applies through the end of that year! Also true AND their parents don't need to do anything for the child to remain enrolled.
- Also, if there is no bus available to get your kiddo to his or her school of origin you, as the foster parent are eligible for reimbursement through WCSD. It's true! All transportation requests are submitted through your child's worker and there is no tracking of mileage involved.
- VERY IMPORTANT—With all of this in mind, you, as the foster parent may not enroll a child in the school your home is zoned for without the worker's permission just because it is more convenient for you. Changing of schools requires a coordinator's approval.

Things can get busy and crazy when you're running from one appointment to another. Everyone gets cranky in the heat and it's easy to forget things. But please remember, NEVER leave your kiddos in the car, not even for a moment! It's illegal and simply not worth the risk.

Did you know that 43 percent of drownings occur in open water such as lakes, rivers, and ponds as opposed to pools?

Even the strongest of swimmers can get into trouble in just a moment. Have fun this summer, but be sure to keep an eye on your kiddos and never assume they're as good as they think they are.

Please make sure you pay close attention to your license renewal date. If you wait until the day your license expires to renew you run the risk of having your license placed on hold if you're missing documents.

On the other hand if you collaborate with your licensing worker and schedule earlier in the month you have more time to collect any missing documents with no affect on your license.
