CALLING ALL HOMES WITH TEENS!

Are you completing your Independent Living Modules? <u>"Introduction to Independent Living Modules"</u> are the instructions for the monthly <u>"Independent Living Modules"</u>. It is required for all foster parents to be going over and documenting with youth age 14 and up on a monthly basis as part of our IL program. The youth's worker will also be following up during their monthly visits.

There are power points/slideshows for additional training and useful information for our youth looking to or who have aged out. (Some of this information can also be used to meet the requirements in some of those modules!)

AND NOW, A WORD FROM YOUR LICENSING WORKERS...

As a reminder, licensing now has a 5th worker!

Zip code assignments have been reassigned —
take a look here as your worker
may have changed!



Starting in September, we are moving to BIENNIAL foster care licenses!



What does this mean? It means that your license will be valid for 2 years instead of one! But don't worry, you'll still get to see our smiling faces each year as we will still be required to do an annual inspection.

The benefit? You won't have to complete the renewal packet every year - only on the year your license expires!

The catch? You will still have to do things that are due yearly such as update any expired TB tests, complete law enforcement forms, fingerprint, provide updated rabies, and have your fire extinguisher serviced.

The Nevada Board of Regents provides a waiver of fees for former Nevada foster youth.

FEE WAIVER

INITIAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS - STUDENTS MUST MEET ALL FOUR (4):

- In foster care in Nevada at the age of 14 years or older;
- Graduated from a Nevada high school or passed the TASC, HiSET, or GED;
- Completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA); and
- Under the age of 26 years

CONTINUING ELIGIBILITY:

- FAFSA Complete the FAFSA each year; and
- Satisfactory Academic Progress Students who meet the initial eligibility requirements are required to meet Title IV financial aid satisfactory academic progress requirements at their institution for continuing eligibility.

THE QPI WEBSITE

Tips for successfully obtaining your certificate after completing an online training through the QPI website:

- "You cannot fast forward if you do the link you need to click on to print your certificate will be disabled.
- Try not to watch the trainings on your cell phone you're more likely to accidentally hit something on the screen that will disable the certificate button.
- "You're only allowed 3 attempts to pass a quiz at the end of the training after that it locks you out and you'll need to contact support at centersupport@usf.edu to get back in. Then you have to watch the video again.
